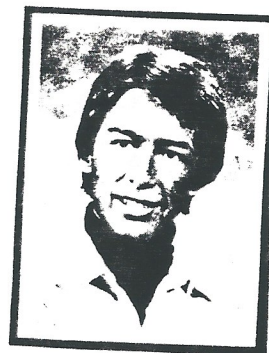
IN MEMORY
