Last spring, a significant lead article appeared in Newsweek Magazine entitled, "Who Needs College?" The cover depicted two recent graduates, dressed in cap and gown trying desperately to hold on to their jack-hammers. The obvious intent of the picture was to raise the question of whether a college education really helps in finding a job, and an even more basic question was implied - whether a college education has any value at

I'm convinced that the questions raised by Newsweek need to be asked, but I'm equally convinced that an affirmative answer can be given, especially in reference to Whitworth. Who Needs College? - a lot of people do if the college has its act together.

A college worth its salt should assist its students in at least three areas. First, it should provide an environment which encourages personal growth and maturity. To live in a complex world which places incredible demands on us requires that we really have it together. Otherwise life can be a series of little hells, each creating a new kind of suffering. But to know who we are and what we are doing can make all the difference.

Second, a college should help its students develop a variety of skills, skills applicable in any situation which comes along. One should graduate from college a better writer and speaker, a more critical and perceptive thinker, able to find information and use it, and more aware and appreciative of cultural differences. These skills, and several others like them are basic to a college education and to any kind of life situation.





It's a privilege for me to be able to say "hello and welcome (or welcome back)." I hope you will use this directory as one way to start to put names and faces together and to learn about the different services of the college.

My charge is to use this space to introduce you to student development. Student development is a term you'll hear a lot at Whitworth for it means a lot of things. For one thing, student development is a primary goal of the college so it appears in a lot of literature and gets talked about in a lot of speeches regarding the college. For another, it's the name of the division responsible for many aspects of student life such as housing, the Health Center, student activities, counseling, student employment, tutorial services, career and life planning, testing, etc., etc. So you're likely to have occasions to interact with student development staff members in these different areas. We want to serve you well and to see that you are treated as the special individual you are.

Most important, however, are the people who make up student development for student development is people. We are people who are in this field of work because we like people. We are vitally concerned about our own growth as individuals and about helping others grow. Because of this, we have invested from one or two to six or more years gaining professional training in this area. We believe in what we do and also believe that one of the most exciting things in the world to be about is the integration of the goal of this college--student/human development with the theme of Jesus Christ.

Who are we and what do we do? Well, let's give a rundown starting with Kaye and Susan in student activities. You've had a chance to read about SAC elsewhere in this directory so I won't in other dimen go into a further description except to say that both Kaye and 9 ment programs.

Susan are employed half time by ASWC and half time by student development. We think this is highly appropriate for it gives an accountability directly to you as students as well as to the college. This interplay of responsibilities is just super, we feel. Stop by SAC and get to know Susan and Kaye; you won't be sorry you did.

In the Health Center, you'll find Georgene Winniford and June Chance waiting to serve you as R.N.s. Marge Green is the night nurse, and Bertha Lord is the clinic assistant. In addition, on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday evenings our health center clinic is staffed by capable young physicians from Family Medicine, Spokane. We are thrilled to have the services of these medical doctors. The Health Center also employs a laboratory technician to work during clinic hours.

Some of our student development staff members live right in the dorms so as to be more readily accessible to you and to get to know you better. In addition to the student staff, the following professional staff are also in the halls to serve you:

Eileen Hendrick, known affectionately by almost all Whitworth students as "mom," begins her 12th year on the resident staff and will once again be living and working in South Warren.

Carolyn Crowder returns for her second year in East and West Warren. You may also run into Carolyn as a TA for some of Dr. Ron Frase's courses.

JoAnn Zwart, who lived and worked in Arend last year, will continue to work half time in Arend but will live in Baldwin-Jenkins and work there the other half of her time.

Neal and Marcia Blankenship return for a second year in Stewart. You should see how their young son, Chad, has grown over the summer.

Sandy Gill comes to us from PLU; and she will be living and working, along with JoAnn Zwart, in B-J.

Rounding out the professional live-in staff is Tom Hartanov who, with his new wife Claudia, will be in Arend. Tom comes to us from Colorado State.

Ballard and McMillan will once again have student head residents, with Jamie Brown and Chris Roberts filling these roles. The ABC Dorms and the Village will also have head residents this year, with Cliff Warner and Robyn Ramer being in these positions, respectively.

Anne Noris will be in her second year as the live-out area director for Ballard and McMillan and will be in her fourth year as a student development staff member at Whitworth.

John Walker who was the RC with the ABC Dorms this past year assumes the role af area director for the ABC Dorms and the Village. Both Anne and John will also be actively involved in other dimensions of the residence life and student development programs.

In addition to Anne and John, other student development staff members who have their offices in the Student Development Center include Lorie Nicolet, who is the neatest person and best receptionist you'd ever want to meet. It's worth the trip to student development just to get to know Lorie.

Barbara Dutcher, administrative assistant, is responsible for office management and has the answers to an awful lot of questions you might have about a variety of matters. Next time you have a question and you're not sure who to take it to, try Lorie or Barb. If they don't have the answer, they can probably tell you who does.

Lillian Whitehouse, associate director of student development, is a person you've just got to meet if you want to see a loving, caring dynamo in action. Lillian knows more people, runs more programs, teaches more classes, advises more students than about anyone we know. In fact, she generally tires the rest of us just watching her. This past year Lillian was honored by the Soroptomist who presented her with the "Women-Helping-Women" Award for her many innovations and activities designed to assist women in our society.

Shirlene Short, associate director of student development and director of resident life, is another individual whose activities and accomplishments are many. Shirlene is responsible for the administration of the residence life program and the selection, training, and supervision of the residence hall staff. In addition, she counsels, is an active member of the Women's Task Force, and occasionally even finds time to ski.

Lelia Brown is in her second year as director of the Learning Resource Center. This means she supervises the tutorial program, works with academic advisement, teaches courses, workshops on study skills, and generally works hard to promote learning services on the campus. She is also active in working with minority students.

Jerry Hermanson is the coordinator of counseling services. Last year Jerry was half time as an area director for Arend and half time as coordinator of counseling. This year Jerry will be full time in the counseling/coordinator role. As such, he is available for individual counseling, coordinates growth groups, provides for the in-service training for those involved in counseling, and develops and provides referral services to help students use the counseling personnel and activities available to them.



Anyway, the purpose of this article is to acquaint you with this year's student body priorities as I presently see them. There are primarily three areas of in terest-financial planning, community development, and ASWC accessibility and sensitivity to this year's student body.

As you probably know, it is becoming increasingly more expensive to attend Whitworth. This problem is by no means exclusive to the Whitworth community. The very institution of private higher education finds itself in a particularly precarious financial situation nowadays. In response to these adverse economic conditions the President's Council has hired me to conduct a financial aid study in order to outline some of the options we as students can undertake. Presently, I am in the midst of that study so at this time I don't have a lot of concrete information to share with you. However, I do have a few things to say.

First of all. I would encourage everyone to read the study when it is completed. A summarized copy of the report will be made available to you through your dorm president (Remember, you're paying me \$900 to do this study so please take the time to make sure that you are getting your money's worth.) Realizing that recommendations are only as good as the effort given to implement them, the President's Council has created the Financial Futures Task Force to do just that. I hope that some of you will want to join us in that endeavor.

Secondly, I would like to tell you about a card that you will be given to fill out during registration which will ask you about the job you held this summer. The reason we are conducting this survey is to determine the potential of initiating a cooperative education program at Whitworth. In a sentence, cooperative 11

education is a program in which a student receives academic credit as well as a salary for working in a job which is directly related to her/his major. Ideally, it is a program in which all parties involved come out ahead. So please take the time to fill out this card because it will provide us with valuable information.

One of the things a small liberal arts college such as Whitworth has to offer which is not always found at a large public university is a community environment which is both personal and diverse in its programming. Such programs as Latin American Week, Recycle the Revolution, and the 1985 Meal Plan have gone a long way in developing our community identity. This year the ASWC will be dedicated to furthering that development process under the aegis of the Intentional Community Task Force. The task force will be involved in a variety of activities such as coordinating a student-trustee dialogue on the alcohol issue, doing a Forum on both the positive and negative aspects of the community dynamics found here at Whitworth, and sponsoring and coordinating a theme week in the spring (similar to Recycle the Revolution in structure) on the topic of human sexuality in a contemporary Christian context. The task force will be involved in a number of other activities throughout the year and we hope that you will choose to involve yourself with the task force as your interests dictate.

Lastly, the ASWC will be very interested in accommodating itself to the ongoing needs and interests of the student body. I will be going door-to-door again at the beginning of the year (I don't know why in the world I ever made that campaign promise!) so if you have any questions, ideas, gripes, etc. please mention them when you see me at that time. The ASWC has allocated \$20,000 in unrestricted funds this year. This money will be spent according to your interests and desires as a student body. Please feel free to approach the President's Council whenever you have an idea or proposal that you would like to see become a reality.

I know that many of you do not have a desire to become heavily involved with the ASWC and its activities. After all, student government can hardly be considered the most important thing in a college student's life. This type of an attitude is a perogative that should, and will, be respected. However, I feel that the ASWC, being an economic and representative collectivity, has a responsibility to its corporate owners to report its economic allocations, programming activities, involvement opportunities, and of course its available services throughout the school year. The Whitworthian, and hopefully the radio station (if it receives its Federallicense) will be used to this end. I look forward to seeing all of your adorable mugs again this fall. Until then, take care and have a good summer!
